The Fulbright Scholar Program

Program History

- Created in 1946 by U.S. Congress and funded by the U.S. Government
- Sponsored by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), as its flagship program
- Administered by the Institute of International Education
- Supports research, teaching, seminar attendance, and professional projects abroad in 100+ countries

Program Goal

- *Our mission is to foster mutual understanding between nations, advance knowledge across communities, and improve lives around the world.*
- *Cultural Ambassadorship*

Principles

- We strive to represent all aspects of diversity in the United States
- Support effective public diplomacy by sending people of diverse backgrounds and perspectives abroad to participate in people-to-people exchanges and programs to promote mutual understanding
- We welcome diversity based on race, ethnicity, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, geographic location, education, income, socio-economic status, and other diversity dimensions

Fulbright supports your family

- Approximately 60% of our awards provide dependent support in funds
 - Use our search filter
 - Check the “Award Benefits” tab
- Most countries allow for family to come abroad with the grantee
- Many Fulbright dependents go on to have international careers

Fulbright supports you from application to grant

- 70% of applicants engage with IIE staff
- Continued support while in country from IIE and host country staff
- Access to alums in the Scholar Directory

Qualifications for U.S. Scholar

- U.S. citizenship
- Degree and experience, as required by award:
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree
 - Master's or professional or artistic experience
 - Teaching experience as required
- Fulbright U.S. Scholar alums are eligible: two year waiting period between your last day on a Fulbright Scholar Award and the next application due date





Fulbright Scholar Awards

- 400+ awards in 100+ countries
- 2-12 months
- Options: Research, Teaching, Teaching/Research, Professional Project, Seminars (2 weeks)
- Flex option: segment your award into 2-3 non-consecutive month(s)-long visits over 1-2 years
- ONE Award per cycle / competition year

Requirements:

- ✓ Application Form
- ✓ Project Statement
- ✓ Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- ✓ 2 Letters of Recommendation
- ✓ Language Proficiency Report *(if required)*
- ✓ Letter of Invitation *(if required)*

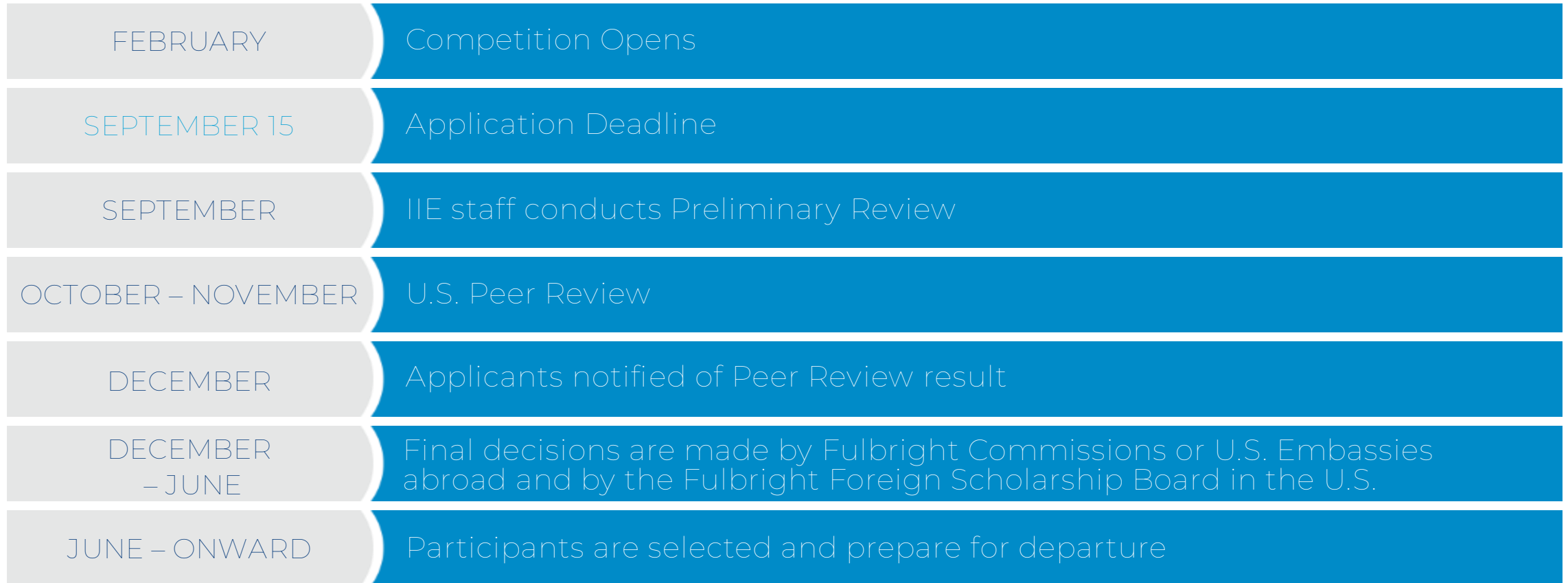
Supplemental Materials:

- ✓ Syllabi or Course Outlines *(for teaching)*
- ✓ Reference List *(for research)*
- ✓ Portfolio *(for disciplines like Arts, Architecture, and Journalism)*

FULBRIGHT SCHOLAR-IN-RESIDENCE (S-I-R) PROGRAM

Host scholars from other countries to teach for a semester or an academic year

Deadline: Proposals due in June to host in the following academic year

FULBRIGHT OUTREACH LECTURING FUND (OLF)

Host current Fulbright Visiting Scholars for short-term lectureships of 2-6 days on discipline or cultural topics to internationalize the campus

FULBRIGHT LANGUAGE TEACHING ASSISTANT (FLTA) PROGRAM
